



Grape Fruit Seed Extract (GSE)

Immunologist, Dr. Jacob Harich founded GSE in 1970. He was initially interested in what GSE could do to help preserve fruit and vegetables and prevent mold growth. Further research shows a natural alternative to antibiotics; a non-toxic substance that helps the human body resist bacteria, viruses, parasites and fungi.

Many uses of GSE:

A natural anti-biotic, immune system booster, parasite preventative, helpful for candida albicans (yeast), diarrhea (in dogs and people), salmonella, staphylococcus, streptococcus, herpes, sore throats, ear infections, gum disease (in the petz life dental spray) travellers diarrhea, infections, drug resistant bacteria, giardia,

Fungal, parasites and bacterial diseases of the skin (no need to rinse afterwards) such as ringworm (GSE diluted with equal amounts of water).

Wounds, hotspots, rashes-mix with 5 parts water or tea and spray on directly. It can also be put in shampoo to help prevent fleas/tics.

Diarrhea/Gastro intestinal disorders in pets- use one drop of the concentrate per 10 lbs. of body weight. Up to 3-5 times a day when there is known infection. The drops are VERY bitter. For GSE tab/capsule use one per 10lbs of body weight. Each capsule equals 10-15 drops of the liquid.

It can be used as a cleaning disinfectant/antiseptic spray. Add 30 drops in a spray bottle with water, On the Trail's citri-zap and ½ cup of orange cleaner and use it for cleaning everything.

If people are worried about the bacteria in raw food they can add a few drops to the food.

10 drops in 1 quart of GSE can kill bacteria and remove pesticide residues on fruits and veggies.

It has been shown to be more effective than hospital cleaners and is not resistant to superbugs.

Veterinarians experimenting with GSE have found that it can be taken internally and there are no known side effects. It does not effect the intestinal flora like anti-biotics do.

Dr. Allan Sachs who has written the book "Grapefruit Seed Extract" says that GSE; a powerful infection fighter is most effective short term. He recommends giving therapeutic doses for several days to a few weeks then substitute for other natural healers such as echinacea.

It can be given in the food, water, and topical application
